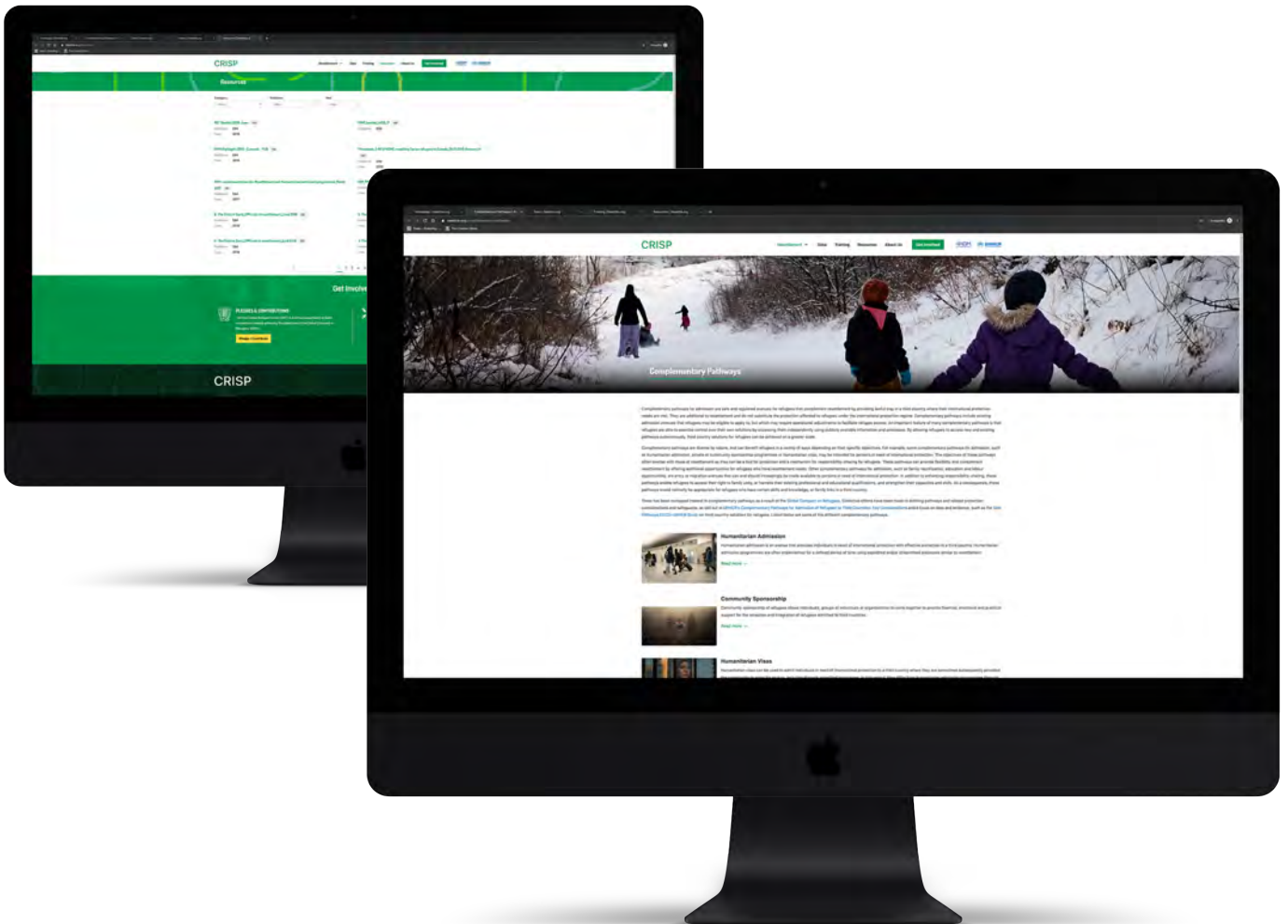

A go-to platform

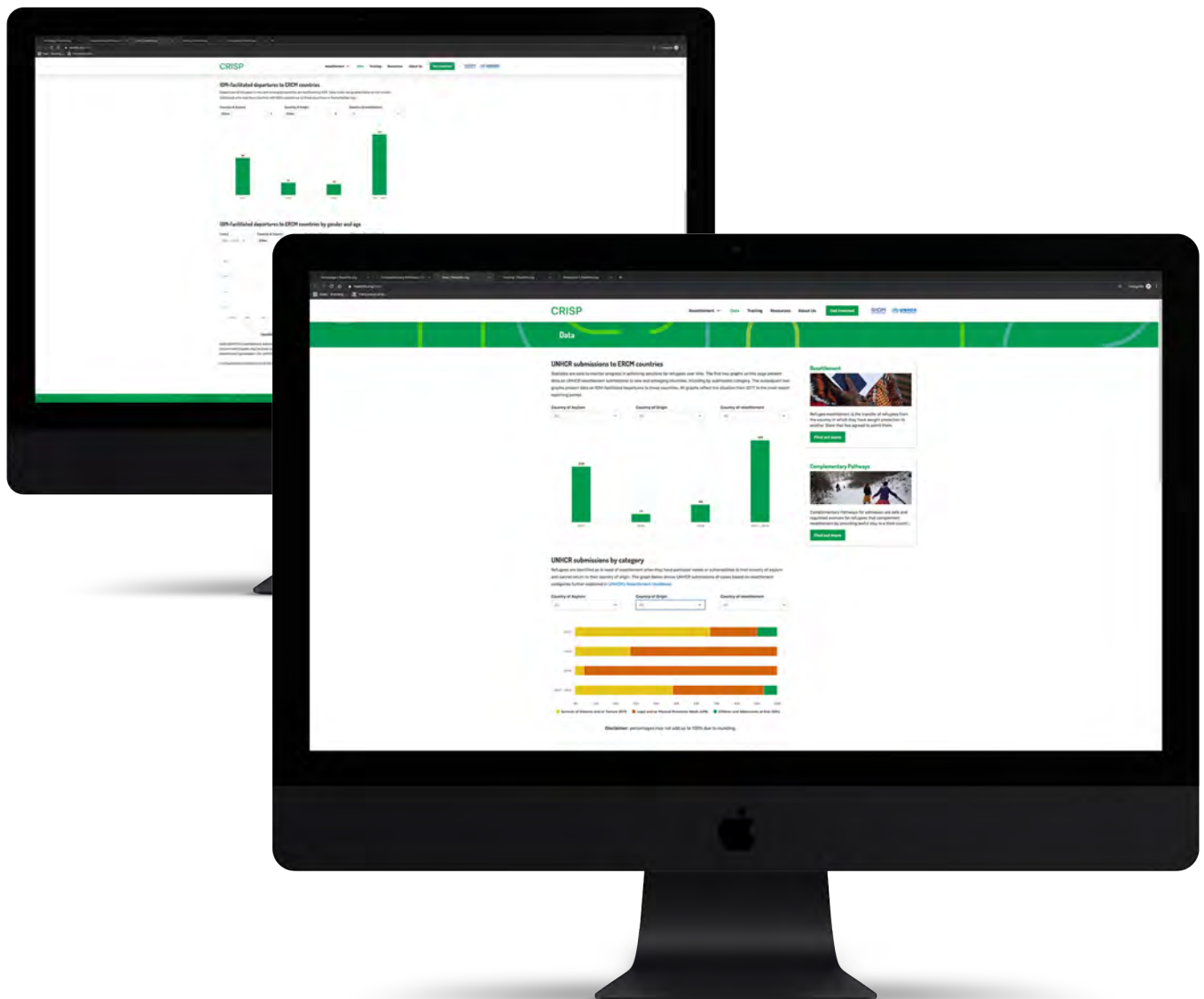

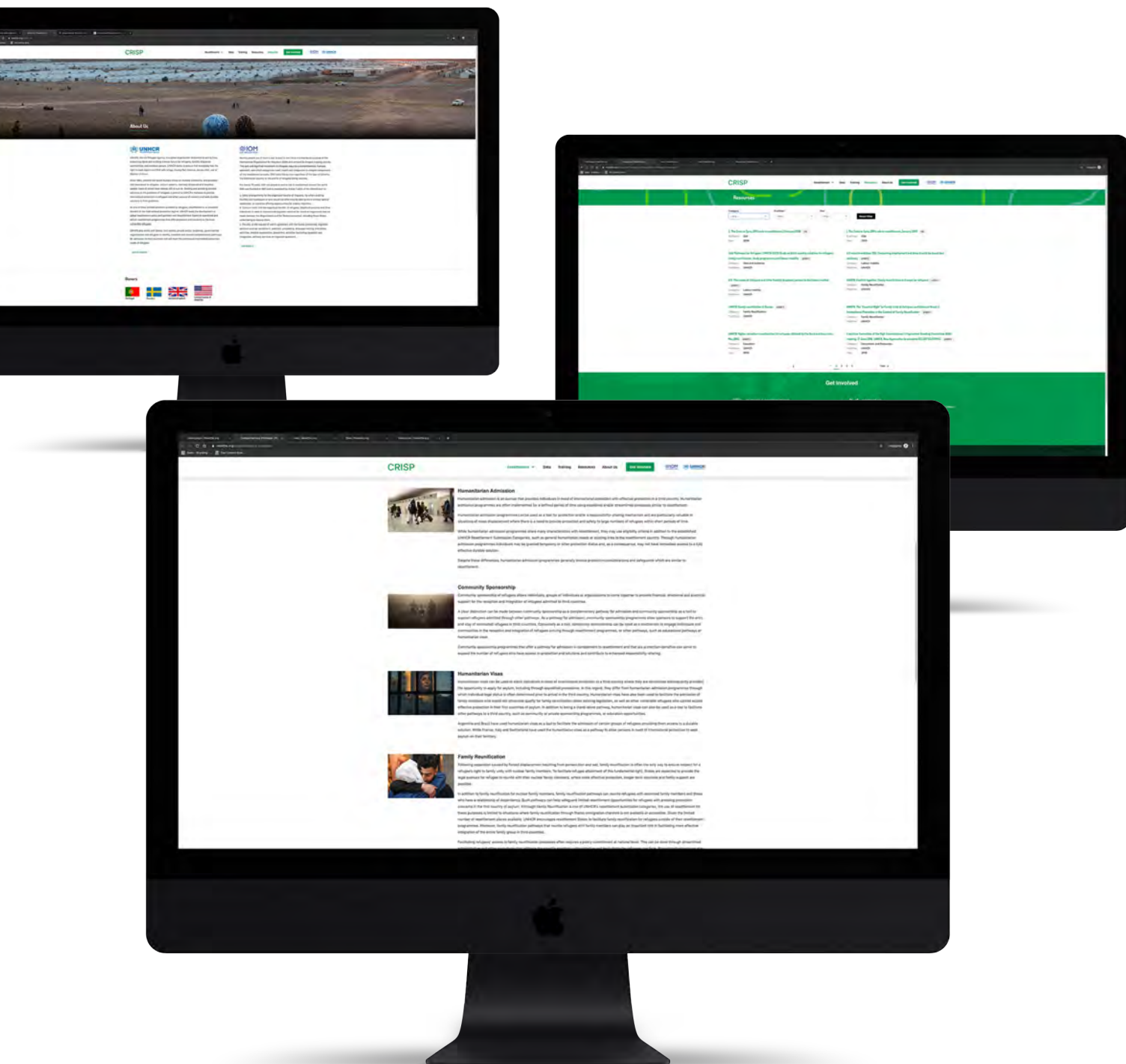


Conclusion
